Step 3: What's Not Working

THE ACTION PLAN

Step 4: A Grace-Filled Reset Plan

Instead of changing everything, choose **one** focus for the next 6–8 weeks.

Choose ONE primary goal:

- More peace | Better consistency | Stronger academics
- More structure | More flexibility | Spiritual growth

Choose ONE practical change:

- Shorter school days | Fewer subjects at once | Clearer weekly rhythm
- More accountability | Outside support | Better planning tools

Step 5: Reset Your Weekly Rhythm

Simple Reset Rule: **Do the most important things first.**

Core Daily Anchors (Example):

1. Prayer & Scripture
2. Reading
3. Math
4. One focused subject
5. Connection time

Everything else is a bonus.

Step 6: Biblical Encouragement
